Product Expiration Dates for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

As you are aware, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) has implemented the following operational changes in response to Governor Wolf's mitigation guidance regarding COVID-19. All Driver License Centers and Photo License Centers, as well as the Harrisburg Riverfront Office Center (ROC), remain closed. These closures include all counties in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Additionally, expiration dates for driver licenses, identification cards and learner's permits are further extended:

- Effective April 30, 2020, expiration dates for driver licenses, photo ID cards and learner's permits scheduled to expire from March 16, 2020 through May 31, 2020, are now extended through June 30, 2020.

A camera card is considered a driver's license, so it is covered by the same terms and conditions extending other driver's license products.

As a reminder, vehicle registrations, safety and emission inspections, and Persons with Disability Placards have been extended as follows:

- Vehicle registrations, safety inspections and emissions inspections scheduled to expire from March 16 through April 30, 2020, the expiration date is now extended through May 31, 2020.
- Persons with Disabilities Parking Placards scheduled to expire from March 16 through April 30, 2020, the expiration date is now extended through May 31, 2020.
